1. THE EVENT

The Event shall be known as the **Light Car Club Khanacross** herein in after to be known as the event. The event will be conducted at Northam Racecourse, 175 Yilgarn Avenue, Northam on a gravel surface and will be a **Club Khanacross**.

The Event will be organised and promoted by the Light Car Club of WA Inc (LCC of WA). The Event is open to current members of the LCC of WA and any club that is affiliated with Motorsport Australia and are holders of a Motorsport Australia Speed/Speed Junior licence or superior.

The Event will comprise of a Khanacross competition in the morning and a Come and Try and Passenger Ride Activities after lunch.

2. AUTHORITY

The Event will be conducted under the provisions of FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, the Khanacross Standing Regulations, "LCC of WA Club Championship(s)" Standard Regulations, The Motorsport Australia Passenger Ride Activity Policy, the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations or Instructions, which may be issued.

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1St, Integrity and Legal and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au

Certain public, property, professional indemnity, and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

4. EVENT DETAILS:

a. Khanacross

Documents to be presented at scrutineering of current Motorsport Australia Speed licence and current car club membership card. The Event shall consist of multiple runs over a single track. The starting order of each run shall rotate through the field of competitors.

b. Come and Try

Motorsport Australia licence and Motorsport Australia affiliated Car Club membership card to be presented at documentation. Introductory licences and one day Light Car Club of WA memberships can be purchased in advance or

on the day. The Event shall consist of untimed runs over a single track. The starting order of each run shall rotate through the field of competitors entered to ensure a fair number of runs.

c. Passenger Rides

This Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy. The minimum age for passengers is 12 years of age. All drivers and passengers wishing to participate must attend a briefing. Passenger Rides will be untimed.

Passengers must wear wrist to ankle cotton clothing, enclosed footwear and a compliant helmet. Drivers must have participated in at least 3 events of an auto test competition.

d. General

Please be aware that the racecourse turf is strictly out of bounds. If any person or vehicle ventures on to the turf the Light Car Club will lose access to the venue. The person (or persons) involved will be barred from all future Light Car Club events.

Due to noise restrictions, any vehicle considered to be excessively noisy will be asked to leave. The Clerk of the Course will be Judge of Fact on this matter.

No re-fuelling can be conducted in the service park. If you have a fluid leak other than water a tarpaulin must be placed under the car. If a fluid spillage does happen, the Clerk of the Course must be informed immediately the spillage occurs.

Lunch will be available at the event for \$5 per person. This can be paid in advance with the entry fee or by cash on the day.

5. CLASSES

The event shall be open to vehicles complying with the classes defined in 1.3 of Group 4K – Khanacross cars. The following 2WD and 4WD classes shall be recognised for placings.

6. JUDGE OF FACT:

All Official(s) shall be appointed to be the **Judge of Fact**, whose duty it is to decide when or whether an automobile has touched or passed a given line.

7. REFUSAL OF ENTRY:

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

8. <u>VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS</u>

- (a) Each vehicle must comply with Schedule A of the Motorsport Australia Manual and Group 4K Regulations.
- (b) All competing vehicles shall be scrutineered for safety and eligibility before the start of the Event, including any convoy run. Particular attention will be paid to general occupant safety, steering, brakes, seat belts/safety harness, seats, tyres and security of objects in the cabin.
- (c) The Clerk of the Course shall rule on the acceptability of any vehicle to compete in the Event and on the class in which it shall compete. Acceptable standards of presentation and condition must be met.

- (d) A driver whose vehicle has broken down may use a replacement vehicle, provided the consent of the Clerk of the Course has first been obtained. The replacement vehicle must be scrutineered, should be in the same class as the original vehicle, and must be used for the remainder of the competition.
- (e) A fire extinguisher of at least 900g capacity AS 1841, complying with Schedule H of the Motorsport Australia Manual must be fitted. Please check expiry date before arriving must be within 3 years of date of manufacture as stamped on extinguisher.
- (f) Windows must be up during competition and vehicles without windows must have window nets or arm restraints.

9. DRIVERS

- (a) Drivers must hold at least a current Motorsport Australia Speed or Speed Junior Licence. No driver shall be under the age of 12 years.
- (b) Junior Drivers 12 and 13 years of age must be accompanied by an experienced instructor. Approval must be given by the Clerk of the Course. This Event will have Instructors in vehicles.
- (c) No driver shall enter a Khanacross in more than one car.
- (d) Each driver must wear apparel and helmet in compliance with the requirements for a Khanacross in schedule D of the Motorsport Australia Manual.
- (e) Each driver must, while competing, wear at least a lap sash seat belt (Type C), in compliance with Schedule I of the Motorsport Australia Manual.
- (f) Any driver or official who consumes or is visibly affected by alcohol or drugs during an event shall be excluded from the event.

10. ABANDONMENT/PROTEST:

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR. Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

11. PRIZES:

Event awards shall be presented for 1st Outright 2WD, 1st Outright 4WD and 1st to 3rd Junior.

12. INTEGRITY, ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES:

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defuelling operation.

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy. Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at www.motorsport.org.au.

Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

13. <u>APPLICATION OF PENALTIES:</u>

Penalties shall be applied as per the Khanacross Standing Regulations.

The base penalties applicable to each test, which then become the time recorded for the penalised driver in lieu of that which was recorded, are:

a) **Plus five (5) seconds** which means that five seconds must be added to the time recorded by that driver on that test for each infringement.

- b) Slowest time plus five (5) seconds which must be calculated in accordance with the following:
 - i. Adding five seconds to the slowest time recorded by a driver who completed that test correctly and without a penalty being applied; or
 - ii. Where the slowest time plus five seconds exceeds double the fastest time recorded by a driver who completed that test correctly and without a penalty being applied, the penalty time to be applied will be double the fastest time.
- c) Slowest time plus five (5) seconds which must be calculated in accordance with the following:

The application of penalties must be as follows for each infringement:

	Penalty Condition	Penalty Applied
i.	Wrong direction	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
ii.	Any other action that can be deemed as incorrectly completing that course (such as reversing after exceeding the limits of a garage)	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
iii.	Failure to complete a test	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
iv.	Running out of order without the prior approval of the Clerk of the Course	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
v.	Failing to stop completely within a mid-course garage	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
vi.	Failing to stop completely at the finish of a test	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
vii.	Finish a test with the car stopped but completely outside the garage	Slowest time plus five (5) seconds
viii.	Finishing a test with part of the car outside the garage boundaries (plus the penalty for striking any flag/marker	Plus five (5) seconds plus any flag/marker strike
ix.	Striking a course marker or flag (including garage boundary marker or flag)	Plus, five (5) seconds per flag/marker
x.	Failure to attempt a test	Slowest time plus ten (10) seconds
