



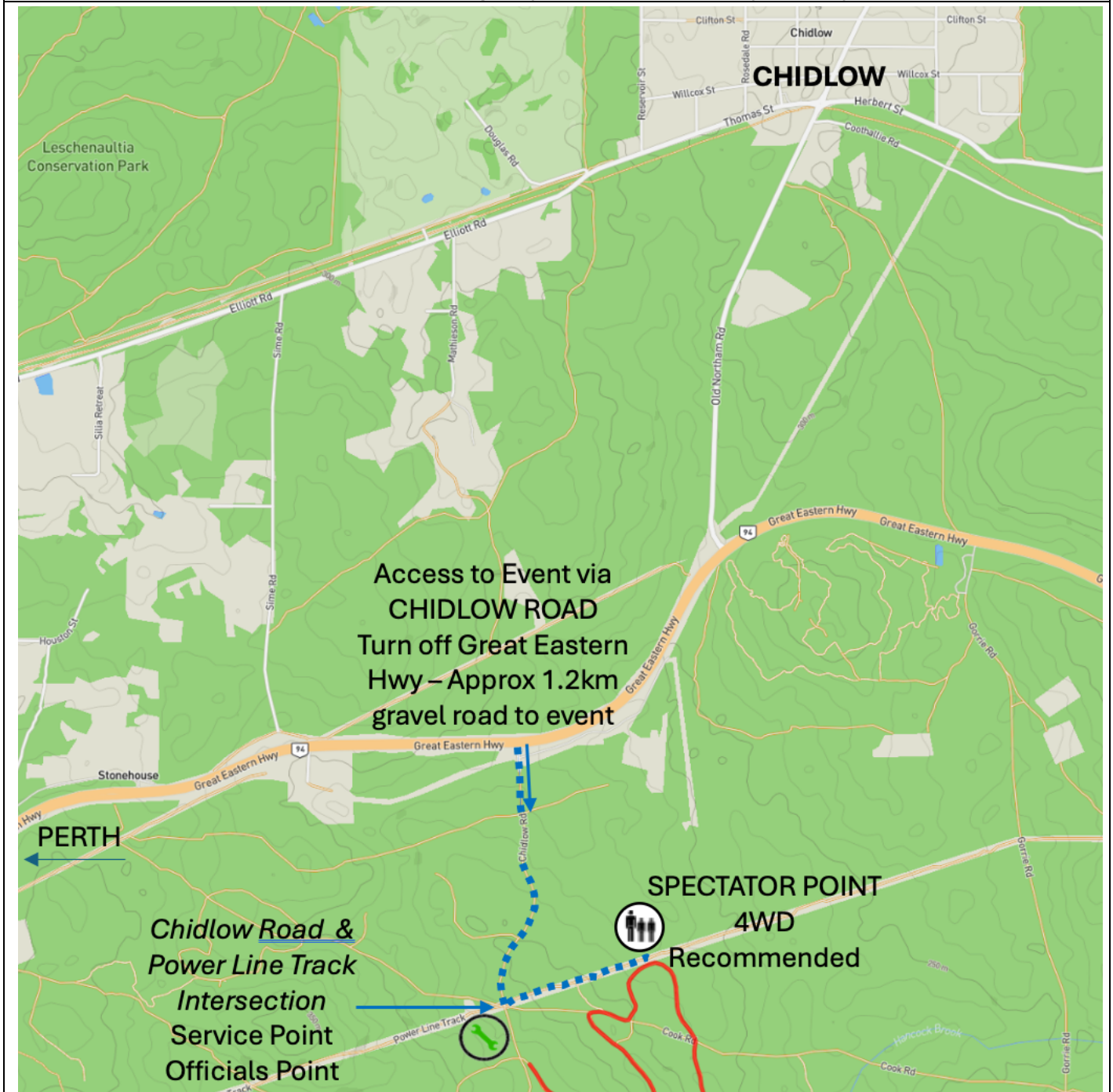

# 2025 Light Car Club of WA Safari Rallysprint

The organising committee of the **2025 Safari Rally Sprint** would like to welcome and sincerely thank you for your assistance with the Event.

As an official you have been assigned to a specific location within the Event and your role is essential to the safety of our Competitors and your fellow officials. These induction notes are intended to acquaint you with the general operation of the rally, as well as to provide a guide to some of the requirements within closed stages, please read carefully. There are prizes for those who can answer the hidden question..

## **Meet Point information:**

**Please arrive at your meet point on time.** The meet point map at the end of this document. If you are running late or unable to attend, then it is vital that you contact us as soon as possible, please ring the Event Officials Coordinator Megan on 0424 779 143 or Wendy 0408 787 130.

Please make yourself known to your Stage Setter or Megan - Look for red i20 with stickers on arrival at the meet point. You may be provided with documentation, please read these instructions carefully as they explain your duties, and more importantly ensure that you and everyone with you are in a safe environment.

**All Officials are to sign the Motorsport Australia Disclaimer before leaving the Meet Point. The Stage Commander, or their representative, will have a copy for you to sign.** You will need to provide emergency contact details, and your CAMS licence number and expiry date should you have one. The Stage Setter will then direct you to your location within a convoy of vehicles, which will take you to your specific location.

Please observe **Convoy Protocol** whilst in transit: Ensure you can see the vehicle behind you at all times. This may require you to slow down or even stop until the vehicle comes back into view. This will cause the vehicle in front of you to respond likewise. Turn headlights on when travelling on unsealed roads. Please observe a Posted speed limits of the roads, as they can be narrow in places.

## **Pre-Event information:**

Be appropriately dressed for your duties. Bring tools required to install rally radio. If provided with a rally cap or hat and safety shirt/ Hi Vis Vest, please wear at all times whilst on duty. Footwear and other clothing should be appropriate for the duties you are to perform. Remember that you may be outside for a significant part of the day therefore you should ensure that you bring a jacket in case the weather gets chilly, which it will.

You should also bring a change of clothing and a waterproof jacket in case of rain. Clothing should not display any branding that is contrary to the sponsors of the event. It is also advisable to bring along sunscreen and insect repellent.

Please bring with you a clipboard, paper and pens, in case you need to complete an incident report. Tools to install Rally radio in your Vehicle , tools required may vary from car to car most will need a spanner that fits battery terminals. Bring sufficient food and drink with you to meet your needs for the day. It is especially important that you have adequate supplies of water. You may also find it worthwhile to bring a chair with you, as it may be more comfortable than sitting in your car for extended periods.

As the event will be running after Sunset please bring adequate light to perform your duties safely. EG. torches, Lanterns etc. If you suffer from allergies (hay fever, asthma, bee stings) or have any other medical condition that require medication, then please ensure that you have brought adequate supplies with you.

Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (of a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at [www.motorsport.org.au](http://www.motorsport.org.au)

Rally Sprint is a public open space and natural reserve and it is preferred that you do not smoke at the venue, and if you choose to smoke dispose of your butts appropriately or else Megan will tell you about the lizard she found choking on one.

Pets are not permitted to accompany you. We are operating in Forest Products Commission land and National Parks animals are not permitted, plus there may be baits for vermin which could prove fatal to your pets.

We all have a duty of care to each other, if you see something that is not safe or believe could be an issue, please advise the event organisers immediately.

Always ensure that your car fuel tank is as full as possible before arriving at your meeting point. Petrol stations may not be open when you finish your duties.

### **Officials General Rally information:**

On arrival at your road closure location, please park your car across the adjoining road to the rally course. It should be parked in a manor:

- That the rally cars will not hit your car or you if they over shoot the intersection,
- Your car will not be hit by flying debris from the rally cars.
- If possible, parked across the road to prevent members of the public from entering the rally course.
- If a member of the public is likely to approach from the road to be closed and it is not possible for them to see your car across the road, or it is expected that the public may arrive at your point, add extra tape and road closure sign across the road at least 10m on the public side of any existing bunting to ensure they will not run into your car.
- If the road you are closing is an Evacuation Route, the Stage Setter will ask you to leave passage for any Emergency Vehicles.

If you have a radio or an operating mobile telephone, then contact Rally Base as soon as possible if any situations arise and advise them of the situation. If you do not have a radio or an operative mobile telephone, and the stage is not yet being run competitively (that is the '0' car has not passed your post), then you should approach the rally course and flag down the next official car to come pass your road closure post and advise them of the situation.

Your **HELP** sign is only to be used in an emergency situation, namely if you require medical assistance or other life-threatening situation exists as the use of this sign will stop the special stage. Under **NO** circumstance should you drive onto the stage to seek help as you will endanger your own life and that of the competitors. You should never leave your road closure point unattended.

If you can't reach the rally base on radio please call Megan on 0424 779 143 or Wendy 0408 787 130.

In an emergency situation such as a bush fire, the stage will be closed and senior officials will enter the stage to coordinate the exit of competitors and officials from the stage. Please wait for and then follow their instructions unless you are in immediate danger. If you are in immediate danger and must leave the area, please try and leave some indication of the direction in which you are going, such as placing a directional arrow on the road. Also be aware that others will either be coming to pick you up or will be in the same situation as you and leaving the area. It is most likely you will come across traffic going in the opposite direction, please drive very carefully. Hidden question is what animal will Megan tell you about if you litter.

The stages are being run twice in the same direction. Sweep will go past you twice and only after the second time or under direction of your stage commander before packing up or leaving your post.

Do not leave your post until you have been advised to do so. After the final run through, the Sweeper vehicle will stop at the control locations and collect the control paperwork and then drive straight through the stage. The rally is now finished on your stage. **Do not leave your post yet!** Depending on the arrangement that has been made, which will be advised to you at your meet point, either the Stage Commander for that stage or the Stage Setter will be along as soon as possible to take you out of the stage.

Please remember to take your rubbish with you or Megan will tell you about the Lizard she found choking on litter and follow your stage commanders instructions.

To contribute to a more efficient cleanup, please pack up your area and gather any tape, mesh, or bunting near the track after sweep has passed. This collective effort aids other officials, who often work late into the night, with the task of packing down.
